Group 2. Sustainability of accreditation overtime from the ESC & center perspectives

- Link routine data collection to registries (legal contract requirement)
- Provide data on effectiveness: demonstrate that participating centers perform better than non-participating centers
- Collaboration industry scientific societies (infrastructure changes remain when prioritaries change, whilst staff might be hard to keep when priorities change). Focus on local/geographic upgrade of infrastructure.
- Phase 4 of RCTs use this phase for implementation of new technologies and drugs

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Group 2. Sustainability of accreditation overtime from the ESC & center perspectives

- Cultural change address the next generation to ensure sustainability
- Benefits for individuals participating in programmes of accreditations (certification, membership, etc)
- Center-specific approach: addressing the complexities of local, regional, and national organisations
- Patient involvement: is accreditation the way to implement the guidelines? Are the good and the great promoted to expand the gap with poorer performers?
