Associate Professor. Lia CROTTI, Italy

Lia Crotti is associate professor of Cardiology at the University Milano Bicocca in Milan and she is the director of the Cardiomyopathy Unit and Rehabilitation Unit of the IRCCS Istituto Auxologico Italiano in Milan, Italy. Furthermore, she is vice-director of the Center for Cardiac Arrhythmias of Genetic Origin and Laboratory of Cardiovascular Genetics of the same Institute.

Lia Crotti is an internationally renowned expert in channelopathies and cardiomyopathies and her research interests are mainly focused on the genetic basis of sudden cardiac death, in genetically transmitted arrhythmogenic diseases, and in more common heart diseases, such as myocardial infarction. Furthermore, her research is focused on the improvement of the clinical management and treatment of patients affected by arrhythmogenic diseases. She is deputy editor of Europace, associate editor of Circulation Arrhythmia and Electrophysiology and co-editor in chief of Cardiogenetics. In 2020 she was elected as vice-chair of the ECGgen group within EHRA and with her center she is part of the ERN GUARD heart that is the European Reference Network for Rare and Low Prevalence Complex Diseases of the Heart. Within ERN-GUARD heart she is leading the International Calmodulinopathy Registry.

She regularly reviews manuscripts for all leading journals in cardiology and she is author or co-author of 191 peer reviewed papers and 20 book chapters. Her total Impact factor is 1506 with a total H-index of 59.

Besides her home Country (Italy) she has been spending research periods in the USA, South Africa, and Germany.
